John Kenneth (Jack) May, 88, Groom Creek John Kenneth (Jack) May of Groom Creek, Arizona died Wednesday, February 22, 2012, at his residence. He was 88 years old. Jack was born September 10, 1923, at Billerica, Essex, England to John C. and Florence (Beeson) May. He attended Brentwood School in Essex, England before becoming a Fighter Pilot for the 19th Squadron of the Royal Air Force during World War II. (Jack moved to Arizona in 1965.) He was the Director of Friendly Pines Camp for many years. After retirement he was ordained an Anglican priest, serving at St. Paul's Church and All Saints' Church. He enjoyed racquetball, golf, flying, and water skiing. Jack is survived by his wife, Bebe Brown May; sister, Daphne Gray of Liverpool, England; son, Christopher May and daughter-in-law Barbara Parenteau May; daughter, Rosemary Taylor; and grandchildren Megan and Nick May and Collin and Brock Taylor. He was preceded in death by his sister Joan Bell. A Celebration of Life will be held Saturday, March 10th at 11:00 am at Friendly Pines Camp, 933 Friendly Pines Road, Groom Creek, Ariz. 86303.
