Supported by the love and prayers of family and friends, Clarence LeRoy Tope, 88, passed peacefully from this life on October 24, 2016.

One of seven sons, he was born on November 11, 1927 in Lilbourn, Missouri, to Harold and Sophia Tope. In 1939, he moved to Prescott with his parents and four of his brothers.
