



## George E Wiant

George E. Wiant of Prescott passed away on April 6, 2019 at the age of 87.

Mr. Wiant is survived by his son Darrin (Corianne) of Showlow, son in law Bill Mosser of Prescott, and grandchildren, Shelby and William Mosser). Mr. Wiant was preceded in death by his wife Marie in 1995 and Helen in 2012, and daughter Kathryn Mosser.

Mr. Wiant was a graduate of Kent State University, with Masters Degrees from Arizona State University and Northern Arizona University. He spent 34 years as a high school teacher, with 30 of those in the Prescott Public Schools as a Business teacher (the last 35 as Department Chair). He was listed in Who's Who in the West and Princeton Global Network. He was also recognized by his high school in 2004 with an award as Distinguished Alumnus. After retiring from teaching he was sent to New Delhi, India and Kharkiv, Ukraine as a consultant for the International Executive Service Corp.

He was a veteran of the Korean War where his unit received the Presidential Citation and the Syngman Rhee Presidential Citation, and personally received 2 Bronze Stars.

Mr. Wiant was charter member, past president, secretary, board director, zone chair, deputy district governor for 21-C, life member, Melvin Jones Fellow, and historian of the Prescott Sunrise Lions. This was the second Lions Club that he helped charter, the first being in North Canton, Ohio.

He was the founder of Frontier Business Systems & Supplies; past president of the Board of Trustees of Sharlot Hall Museum; past Chair of the Prescott

Planning & Zoning Commission; member of the Prescott City Alternative Delivery Services Committee, and city of Prescott Board of Adjustments. He was active in helping Business here and abroad other countries.

Committal Service with honors will be Thursday April 25, 2019 at 11:00am at the Prescott National Cemetery.

A Celebration of Life will be held Sunday April 28, 2019 at 2:00pm at the Prescott Adult Center 1280 E. Rosser St. Prescott, AZ.
