Always wanting to accomplish the latest pattern, Mary would delve into the task with a passion; especially if she saw someone else make an item that she was unaware of. Let's just say, she insisted her family take many trips across the universe to find a particular yarn for a scarf pattern she found!

Music was always flowing from her lips with a song or humming a tune. For years she sang as a soprano in Sweet Adelines with her beautiful voice.

Once Rocky and Mary moved to Prescott, their porch swing was occupied by both of them waving and smiling at neighbors while Mary hummed along with the creaking of the swing.

Mary was immensely proud of her family and the walls of her home were adorned with their photos. Everyone was called “sweetheart or honey.” Her favorite saying was “it could be worse.” She didn’t let the difficulties of life get in the way of the song in her heart.

Other than her children, her pride and joy was her beautiful garden! Mary’s entire yard was adorned with the colors of the rainbow with her meticulously well-tended irises, flowers, shrubbery and trees. The neighborhood was brighter and sweeter with her little house on the corner showering everyone with floral joy. Even in her aging years, she would be found outside climbing over the retaining walls to pull weeds and keep her property pristine and the flowers blooming!

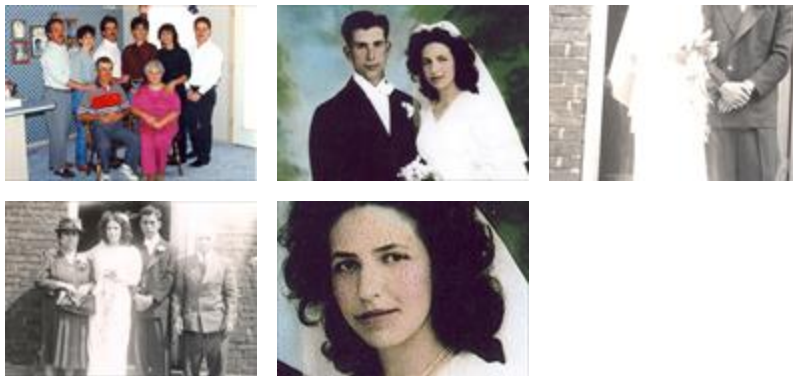
