Patricia (Pat) Lash, age 89, passed away on February 5, 2013 at her home in Prescott, Arizona. She was born on January 7, 1924 in Alhambra, California to James and Gladys (Bollon) Lannan.

Pat was a loving mother, teacher and librarian; guiding and helping children were her life's work. She taught third grade at Miller Valley School in the early 1960s and then at Taylor Hicks when it opened. She later moved to Lompoc, California where she served as Children's Librarian at the city library. She had a Master's Degree in Library Science from the University of Arizona in Tucson. She returned home to Prescott in 2000, with her son.
